

Comments

Jake really tried to push our understanding of the material deeper so he would assign quizzes at the start to help us articulate our thoughts first. He would encourage respectful disagreement so we could be better understand different others and our own arguments.

This class was discussion based it the discussion, specifically Jake's questions, really helped me engage more deeply with the material.

Discussion was really interesting because people had different opinions on topics and the conversations stayed lively. If most people agreed on a topic we discussed and the conversation was not as back and forth, Jake would bring up counter points that were really helpful at bringing out deeper discussions and opinions. At the beginning of discussion we wrote out a short answer to a question Jake posed that were helpful at gathering thoughts regarding the topics of discussion.

I really enjoyed the discussion sections we had. We got the opportunity to hear from a variety of people and perspectives and Jake did a great job of balancing teaching us but letting us discuss as well.

I thought that the discussion was extremely helpful for my learning because I got to hear a variety of perspectives about the different topics we talked about each week. Also, the questions we were asked in discussion made me think of things in ways I hadn't considered before, so I got a lot out of it and learned a lot.

Office hours helped a lot, and since this was a discussion section the discussions held in class were the most beneficial.

Doing research for the learning activities – readings, podcasts, etc... Helped me better understand topics I otherwise wouldn't have cared about.

This course works well for students who are either first or second years or who are not typically students of history. The course and discussion cover a wide range of topics related to democracy and society. However, it does not seem to be at all structured for the benefit of media studies students.

I didn't mind the written portion at the start of discussion although sometimes I would get nervous that my answer was not comprehensive enough.


Although I did not like the readings or the viewpoint the course I found Jake did a good job of engaging the class.

Comments

Jake would encourage respectful disagreement so we could be better understand different others and our own arguments. He would want students to take a hard stance and defend them to the class.

Jake was very clear about what types of speech would be tolerated (engaging and academic speech) and what would not be tolerated (hate or disrespectful speech), and I thought he always did a good job about allowing people to expand and engage with their perspectives.

Its a class on democracy and pressing issues to that. The discussion constantly brings up different political opinions and Jake has always welcomed and pushed for respectful discussion.

He gave everyone the opportunity to share their views and elaborate on why they felt that way. I never felt inclined to say something I did not believe because I knew it was a safe space to discuss.

We were often talking about pretty controversial topics, but he always welcomed all perspectives.

The whole point of the discussion section was to have different opinions and discuss them. Therefore if somebody had an opposing idea it made for a more interesting class.

Jake fostered open discussion on controversial and heavy topics by encouraging students to take opposing sides and share their thoughts. This was helpful in learning about multiple aspects of arguments around topics for the class.

Jake was always leaving room for everyone to make a comment or share their opinion. He really did a great job at creating a productive environment for debate.

Jake listened to what everyone had to say. Tried to get everyone to participate and even played devils advocate for topics where everyone agreed (he would take the other side so we could get a well rounded understanding of the subject)

Encouraged disagreement and understanding different perspectives.

I thought John did a great job at respecting everyone's opinion, even if it was different from his own, and he would always play devil's advocate to try and get everyone to think about their own opinions and positions during discussions. He encouraged everyone to speak and share their minds and was very kind and understanding.

He mentioned in the beginning of the semester that he accepts any views that aren't prone to hate. Very open-minded.

Jake always pushed us to express our opinions, regardless of if that created productive conflict in discussion. We were able to work through the material much easier this way, and having an understanding of both sides was only possible because of his direction. 10/10 TA. Couldn't have asked for a better leader in section.

He made sure to call on everyone to make sure no one dominated the speaking time we had available to us.

I think Jake was able to create an environment that respected differences because he was so willing to play the devil's advocate for all signs of the argument. It really let people share their opinions on the discussion

Every opinion was welcomed and Jake was very smart about offering counter arguments that lent a path to a diverse discussion.

Jake provided helpful, constructive feedback on writing assignments and provided ample opportunity for class participation. Overall, I thought he did a really great job of helping to guide my learning through this course.

The class itself touches on topics that are controversial, so when we have discussions everyone is going to have different opinions. He didn't make anyone feel like their opinions were wrong and even encouraged us to have dissenting views from one another

we could all share our opinions on varying subject matter in a respectful way!

He encouraged people to take an opposing stance to foster discussion because most people agreed on issues we debated

All students were encouraged to share their viewpoints in class

John was consistent in his encouragement of students to share their own opinions on the lecture material. He often posited an opposing viewpoint and encouraged students to challenge it with their own argumentation. He welcomed dissenting opinions and wanted students to view all lecture content with a critical eye, even when the answers to such questions appeared cut and dry.

He always played devils advocate when the whole class agreed on something and pushed people to speak what they really thought/ would not judge them after the fact or press them for strong opinions.

He wanted to take on perspectives that were not advocated for sufficiently in class.

Due to the nature of the course and its topics, John gave space for differing perspectives and even when there were none, he provided new and different perspective to further our knowledge.

He iterated in our very first discussion section that this classroom was a safe space and that he would not tolerate hatred of any kind.

I think in this course in particular where people can bring very charged opinions into the shared space, he ensured that everyones opinion felt heard and valued in the general discussion. When there was a majority opinion, he would make sure to support the

minority opinion in being discussed by the class as a whole!

Would always underline strengths and flaws of ideas

He was open to, and highly encouraged, dissent within the group: specifically like he wanted both sides of an issue to be argued and heard. It made the classroom really engaging. Also—there was a lot of room for different political ideas while having a STRICT LINE he set about bigotry and hate speech. It was good to allow perspectives, but often that opens the gates for hateful perspectives, so it was GREAT that he set that line—that hate is not an acceptable "opinion" to voice in the classroom

He advocated for people to have different opinions even when the majority felt one way about something. He made an effort to consider what an opposing or diverse perspective would look like even if that were not present in the classroom. He made an effort to encourage everyone to participate but also did not get mad if you didn't want to. He was also very approachable in office hours or via email if you needed any help with something.

Actively encourged disagreement and discussion on said disagreements, even if they were very specific and niche.

He encouraged that we played devils advocate so if I ever had an idea that didn't go with the majority opinion I felt very safe to share it .. even if it wasn't right he encouraged the idea

He always made a point to look at both sides of the arguments and allowed and encouraged everyone to speak.

Jake was always open to alternative viewpoints and disagreement. However, I found the overall nature of the class to constrain my opinion, not Jake himself.

He repeatedly stated that he wants people to disagree and heavily emphasized that all viewpoints are equally valid while keeping his own personal views out of the picture to ignite thoughtful and diverse discussion.

Jake encouraged us to debate with each other and when nobody was there to debate, he played devil's advocate and got us thinking about our views. He welcomed all perspectives in a respectful manner. I think he did a great job as a TA and discussion leader!

He always tried to facilitate opposing viewpoints from students while also ensuring that "opposing viewpoints" crossed the line into hate speech or anything.

What constructive suggestions do you have to help John Calhoun improve this course for future students?

Comments

Release the questions asked in discussion section in case students want to think more about them in their own time.

In terms of the introductory writing prompts, I thought they were fine. They were good at helping me collect my thoughts, but I don't think I would've missed them if they were gone.

I'm never one to advocate for discussion posts because who actually wants to write them, but I think they might help for this class to gather your thoughts prior to class so theres more time for discussion. This is more of a class policy and syllabus issue though, so I don't really have suggestions for Jake and discussion

I honestly did not love the opening attendance questions, I'd rather get right into discussion and have more time to talk as a group rather than individually sharing our thoughts.

I do not think the assignment to write your thoughts at the beginning was beneficial because I feel like it only took time away from the discussion.

I thought the short answer assignments were helpful in gathering thoughts before class

Honestly, nothing. Go Jake!

I dont understand his grading system. I felt my earlier papers which I got worse grade on because they were more passionate were better than my later ones which felt very robotic.

I don't think the writing on paper at the start of each class had any effect on me

I thought he did a great job with his discussion section, and honestly don't think there is much he could do to make it better. I think the course itself was leaning to the left, which isn't necessarily a bad thing. However, I think it could be useful to try and focus on democracy in danger as an issue for that is more apolitical, and I think sometimes the course content and readings leaned into issues being more a fault of the right. This isn't a criticism of his discussion, but I think that democracy being in danger is something that everyone should work together on, and sometimes the class being left—leaning made it seem like the professors thought democracy was in danger, but that they didn't want to work with conservatives on the issues.

there was one instance when someone said something problematic in class and I think John did a really good job of addressing it, I was actually very impressed with how he addressed it, in general the only thing I would say is that I think small group discussion may have been nice for people like me (I'm a little anxious about speaking in class)

Maybe be more stern with controlling students out of line behavior.

I think the early writing prompts were helpful to get my thoughts on the page, but I think we didn't need as much time on them at the beginning of class. Also, I think Jake contributed too much at times and would've valued hearing other students more (though what he said was helpful).

I think the writing assignments for attendance were valuable. It helped us to gather together thoughts about the week and deeper engage into the course readings. I also think the discussions were overall structures really well.

I wasn't a huge fan of the writing/brainstorm prompts in the beginning of each discussion, but I think that may just be a personal learning preference of mine.

Perhaps holding more flexible office hours and faster email response would benefit students. Otherwise it has been a pleasure

I liked the way that attendance was taken through our smaller short–response answers. With this being said, the guidelines for attendance were not very clear for this course. The syllabus, as provided by the professors, said that discussion attendance was required but made no mention of how this would impact our course grade. Communications from the TA did not align with the materials given by the professors. The TA made it seem as if missing discussion sections would directly penalize our grades.

It would be helpful for the discussion section to have more structure. It sometimes felt that we were talking ourselves in circles in class without actually arriving at any point or conclusion.

Some time spent in discussion on what is expected for future assignments would be helpful.

He did a great job, but maybe in the future trying to specifically address topics in a timely manner (maybe laying out a plan?)

I think beginning discussion section with a weekly rundown/summary rather than the written attendance response. I think this would encourage class participation by starting us all off on the same page.

I think potentially providing more of an overview of how the podcast assignment is going to be evaluated would be helpful for the future.

I think allowing silence is okay sometimes. It takes time for people to think of responses. A lack of an immediate response is not a sign that we are not engaged and that you need to interject.

Most of my emails were responded to within 24 hours but a few towards the beginning were not responded to at all

I really enjoyed the activities and like general knowledge quizzes (like the chief justices one). I think if we did that every class it would be super interesting.



He was very encouraging and wanted us to speak up if we had any different opinions

He is such a nice guy and made everyone in class comfortable, talking to everyone and telling jokes, and making the classroom enjoyable and welcoming.

He allowed for the expression of views that contradicted his own and didn't discriminate against racial minorities.

From day one he made it a point that he did not tolerate any racism, homophobia, bigotry, or anything of the like, which established a comfortable environment. He also made sure to analyze a situation from all sides and how it might effect different classes of people, super important in a history class

John would often make unprompted political comments, but in general, I thought he was open to different perspectives.





If he is to TA this course again, the only improvement would be to learn more on the subject matter, which he likely already has simply by being a TA. There would often be situations where he would admit he didn't know the intricacies of the subject, but he admitted that China was not his initial area of historical expertise so it was understandable. However, his overall understanding of history and recognition of things he didn't know was very helpful.

It would be helpful to receive feedback from the first midterm a little earlier so we know where we stand in the course. However, I recognize there are a lot of students in the course and it is difficult to get through a large number of exams quickly.

I would suggest for the sake of his next students that he should really just spell out the terms from Professor Reed's lectures. 


